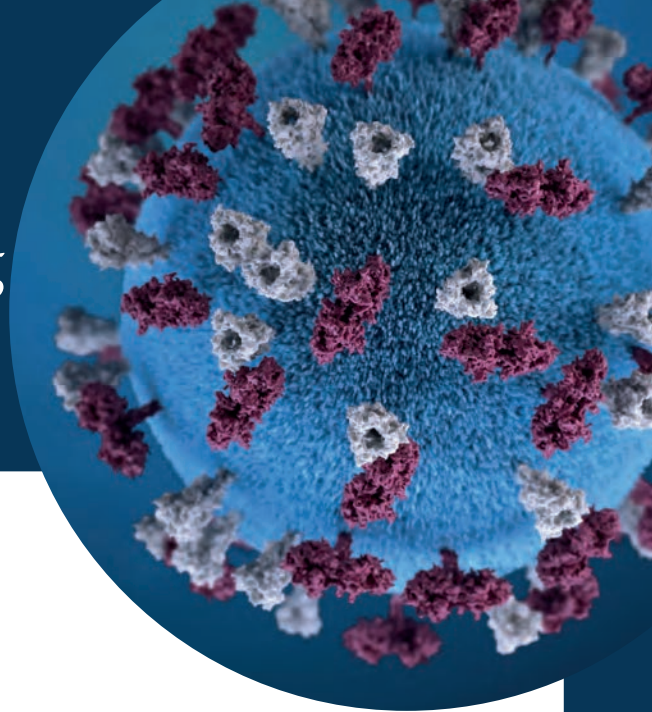


Safer Homes:

Garden bonfire advice during Coronavirus pandemic



East Sussex Fire and Rescue Service is asking people not to have garden bonfires.

Neighbours and the more vulnerable members of our community who are self-isolating need to get fresh air into their homes.

While there are no laws against having bonfires, there are laws for the nuisance they cause.

A more responsible approach would be to compost, or recycle, your garden waste until local recycling centres re-open. These are not only safer options, but are also better for the environment.

HOUSEHOLD WASTE

It is an offence to burn household waste and anyone who does so could face prosecution.
